I don't know if you have seen anything of the David Attenborough series 'Parenthood'? As usual various creatures and their offspring really draw you in. Parents make sacrifices for their children, but then they let them go - even if they are still just eggs in some cases! This is on my mind today as we helped Esther move out, and into her new gear in town. It really does feel like letting our fledgling go - although in her mid twenties now she's probably big enough.

Parents will now be getting ready to send their children 'back to school'. Some will be starting off the first time at school or nursery. Probably in many cases the parents will be more nervous than the children! Heartbreakingly in the world there are parents who will not get to take their children home from school. I'm thinking of little ones shot while in church in Minneapolis. Others have faced bombing in Ukraine or hunger in Gaza. It is the worst of heartaches for a parent to lose a child or to see them in pain and be unable to help. One of Jesus' most famous stories is of a father with an aching heart, whose child is lost. We call it the story of the prodigal son - but really it's the story of a loving father and of his overwhelming joy when his lost child returns to him. God is a father whose heart aches for all his children, for a world full of suffering. He has done more than send 'thoughts and prayers' to those who grieve. He sent his own beloved son, the founder healer, to bring the lost home. The father's heart aches for and understands our sorrow. He has paid the price for our forgiveness and healing and he gives as the privilege of calling "Our father".
